Solution 1: D)

3 tells us about teachers that threatened to fail those students who did not take private lessons from them. It can be argued that barring teachers from giving private lessons can check these practices. 4 talks about how teachers that gave private tuitions were unpunctual as well as negligent of their school responsibilities. Banning private lessons can make such teachers pay more attention to their school responsibilities. It is clear that 3 and 4 lend support to the school's decision to bar its teachers from giving private lessons or being associated with any coaching institute. Thus, (d) is the right answer.

1 says that the school underpays its employees, which makes it unfair to bar the teacher from giving private lessons and supplementing their income. 2 tells us that multiple teachers from the said school are associated with a coaching institute that provides free evening classes to underprivileged students. Barring such teachers from helping those students is certainly an unkind decision.

Solution 2: D)

It is only by not not letting the ambulance through until the convoy has passed that Sanjeev will be strictly following his superiors' orders and thus prioritizing his professional obligations over compassion. Thus, (d) is the right answer.

By following (a) and (e), Sanjeev will clearly be prioritizing compassion over his professional obligations. Following (b) will show that Sanjeev, although mindful of his professional responsibilities,



finds it equally important to let compassion govern his actions whenever he can. By following (c), Sanjeev will be prioritizing personal gains over both compassion and duty.

Solution 3: A)

Cooking her meals instead of going out or ordering in for a month would be the wisest decision to make. Thus, (a) is the right answer.

(b) and (d) might have detrimental effects on her health. (c) might negatively affect her credit score. Also, (c) and (e) will cause her to incur fines that she will have to pay later, thus increasing her expenses for the following month.

Solution 4: C)

Ideally, Mrs. Sharma should forgive the kid but ask Meenakshi to be more careful in the future. Kid's often break things and one should forgive them for their mistakes. Thus, (c) is the right answer.

(a) will be too harsh a reaction and the situation does not warrant it. (b) is an unwise thing to ask for. Neither would it be ideal for the toddler to be left alone at home, nor would it be practical to expect Meenakshi to be able to hire a babysitter. (d) and (e) are not ideal reactions. We are told that the vase was expensive, which helps us infer that a domestic help will find it difficult to pay for it either in installments or in a single payment.

Solution 5: B)

Anirban should publish the report without concealing any facts or details as it is the responsibility of a journalist to disseminate the truth, especially if it is about a public representative. Thus, (b) is the right answer.

(a), (c), (d) and (e) are incorrect. Following none of those would ensure upholding the principles of honest journalism.



Solution 6: D)

Agrima should hold regular gender sensitisation sessions at work. This will not only help employees accept Gagan in their midst but will ensure that no other employee is harassed or discriminated against on account of their gender. Thus, (d) is the right answer.

(a) would be unfair as a transgender person should be given the right to express their gender in the form of the clothes they wear. (b) would not be appropriate as harassment is not a result of the actions of the harassed; it is the one who harrasses that should be held responsible for it. (c) would be too harsh. Ravish should be given a chance to correct his behaviour towards Gagan and gender sensitisation sessions might help him do so successfully. (e) is incorrect. Agrima is responsible for how an intern in her firm is treated by fellow employees. If she does not take positive steps towards handling the situation, it might get increasingly difficult for Gagan, and other transgender employees in the future, to work at her marketing agency.

Solution 7: D)

As an honest employee, Manu should either borrow money to repair the laptop or ask his employer to get the screen replaced and deduct the total expenses from his salary in affordable installments. Thus, (d) is the right answer.

2 is an inappropriate approach. Asking the technician to replace the faulty screen with a cheap copy of the original is akin to cheating and certainly not something that an honest employee would do.

Solution 8: E)

(a) and (b) are appropriate responses to Mr. Tyagi's actions. Sexual harassment is a crime and should be treated with appropriate. (c) is also appropriate as it is a step towards making sure that students feel



comfortable with reporting such incidents in the future even if their complaint is against a person in authority. Thus, (e) is the right answer.

Solution 9: A)

Among all the options, only (a) will allow Neeraj to have an open conversation with Sumedha. Thus, (a) is the right answer.

(b) and (c) are incorrect as they are loud or crowded places and thus not conducive to a conversation. (d) is not the most ideal setting for a conversation either. (e) is incorrect as Neeraj and Sumedha might be surrounded by his family and therefore might not feel comfortable talking about their feelings for each other.

Solution 10: C)

Revathy's mother is an adult who has the right to choose how, and with whom, she wants to spend her life. Revathy should not only support her mother in her decision but also help her with the wedding preparations. Thus, (c) is the right answer.

Her mother's decision to remarry in her sixties should not be a source of embarrassment for Revathy. Instead, she should be proud of her mother for having the courage to choose her own happiness in a world where old people are thought to have no desires and ambition. (a), (b), (d) and (e) are inappropriate. As a daughter, Revathy should stand by her mother's side and support her in her decision to remarry, irrespective of her age.
