Important points to remember when attempting the descriptive section:

- **Strictly adhere to the word limit.**
- **Use simple sentences.**
- **Avoid complicated or very difficult words.**
- **Use connectors such as ‘for example,’ ‘additionally,’ ‘on the other hand,’ to connect ideas smoothly.**
- **Keep a neutral tone. Do not use extreme or emotional words.**
- **Check your essay and letter. Keep grammar, spellings, and punctuation correct.**
