'Fiscal' is the apt synonym of 'pecuniary'.

Pecuniary (adj.) = relating to or consisting of money

Fiscal (adj./n) = relating to public money or other financial matters; relating to government finance and taxes

Excrete (v) = to get rid of material such as solid waste or urine from the body

Dismal (adj.) = sad and without hope; very bad

Lag (v/n) = to move or make progress so slowly that you are behind other people or things

Ans: C

Sol:

'Preclude' is the apt synonym of 'interdict'.

Interdict (n/v) = to prohibit or forbid (something)

Preclude (v) = to prevent something or make it impossible, or prevent someone from doing something

Malleable (adj.) = easy to shape or bend

Extraneous (adj.) = irrelevant or unrelated to the subject being dealt with; not directly connected with or related to something

Plausible (adj.) = (of an argument or statement) seeming reasonable or probable; a plausible person appears to be honest and telling the truth, even if they are not

- 3. Dilatory
- a. Purity

Ans: b

Sol:

Dilatory: slow to act; slow and likely to cause delay

Tardy: slow in action or response

Gaudy: extravagantly bright or showy, typically so as to be tasteless Dandy: a man unduly concerned with looking stylish and fashionable

Hence Dilatory and Tardy are synonyms to each other.

Scurry: (of a person or small animal) to move hurriedly with short quick steps

Hasten: to move or travel hurriedly Stroll: to walk in a leisurely way

Resurge: to become popular or common again Bode: be a portent of a particular outcome

Hence Scurry and Hasten are synonyms to each other.

Refractory: stubborn or unmanageable

Obedient: complying or willing to comply with an order or request; submissive to another's authority

Refined: elegant and cultured in appearance, manner, or taste

Obstinate: stubbornly refusing to change one's opinion or chosen course of action, despite attempts to persuade one to do so

Hence Refractory and Obstinate are synonyms to each other.

Trice: in a moment; very quickly.

Instant: a very short time; a moment.

Hence Trice and Instant are synonyms to each other.

Verve: vigour and spirit or enthusiasm.

Bitter: feeling or showing anger, hurt, or resentment because of bad experiences or a sense of

unjust treatment.

Zest: great enthusiasm and energy.

Miserable: (of a person) wretchedly unhappy or uncomfortable.

Hence Verve and Zest are synonyms to each other.

'Scuttle' is the correc synonym of 'hasten'.

Hasten (v) = to be quick to do something; to move or travel hurriedly

Scuttle (n/v) = to move quickly, with small, short steps, especially in order to escape

Culinary (adj.) = relating to cooking or the kitchen

Vegetate (v) = to live in a way that has no physical and mental activity

Raver (n) = a person who has an exciting and uninhibited social life

'Rigorous' is the correct synonym of 'attentive'.







Attentive (adj.) = paying close attention to something

Rigorous (adj.) = extremely thorough and careful; strict; harsh; severe or difficult, esp. because at a high level

Hogtie (v) = to fasten someone's hands and feet together, or to fasten all four legs of an animal together; to make it difficult or impossible for someone to do something

Careen (v) = to go forward quickly while moving from side to side

Scramble (v/n) = to move or climb quickly but with difficulty, often using your hands to help you

Sol:

'Spurious' is the correct synonym of 'fallacious'.

Fallacious (adj.) = based on a mistaken belief; not correct

Spurious (adj.) = false and not what it appears to be, or (of reasons and judgments) based on something that has not been correctly understood and therefore false

Scurrilous (adj.) = expressing unfair or false criticism that is likely to damage someone's reputation; rude and cruel, and sometimes damaging

Staid (adj.) = serious, boring, and slightly old-fashioned

Stolid (adj.) = (of a person) calm and not showing emotion or excitement; (of a thing) not interesting or attractive
